BEING A MISSIONARY IS HARD

After Jonathan Edwards' high profile ministry in Northampton, MA, he was forced out of his pulpit by a congregation that had grown weary of his preaching. He left there to become a missionary to Native Americans. Here's a digestion of Wes Carpenter's summary:

After Edwards had spent more than half his life in the place where his name may always be associated, he left Northampton. Officially, his Stockbridge mission began Aug 8, 1751, although his new congregation never had more than 18 families. However, evangelizing to Native Americans that spoke a completely different language was quite different from the ministry at Northampton.

The Stockbridge mission consisted of a few hundred Mohawk Indians. Upon Edwards' arrival, the original missionary, Sergeant, suddenly died. He died young, but his missionary service was not in vain. Almost 125 Indians had been baptized and a small school had been established. Edwards would continue to reap the harvest that was sown prior to his coming.

Iain Murray: "Edwards' surviving sermon notes revealed he worked hard to adapt and simplify sermons for the Indians, dropping illustrations which he had used at Northampton, and substituting others which were more familiar to their culture."

Edwards' finances were at rock bottom. He found himself preparing sermons on the covers of letters and scraps of paper. Preaching sermons to the church included both English and Indian audiences. However, this was done at separate times since an interpreter was needed for addressing the Indians. "Edwards didn't shrink from preaching terror to the Indians or from explaining in narrative terms some hard points of Calvinism, such as original sin and reasons for God's wrath and judgment." The Stockbridge Indian congregation had much respect for Edwards, but there were no reports of remarkable conversions.

Edwards remained in Stockbridge until 1758– approximately seven years. The Lord Jesus, our Lamb, is worthy!

ENDURING TRIALS

CShare in suffering as a good soldier of Christ Jesus" (2 Timothy 2:3 ESV). Timothy had a good deal of hardship he had to endure. He had to oppose false doctrine, "As I urged you when I was going to Macedonia, remain at Ephesus so that you may charge certain persons not to teach any different doctrine" (1 Timothy 1:3 ESV). Teachers in the church had departed from a Christ centered gospel ministry and were side tracked into false teaching thus leading the church astray. This was no small trial for Timothy to refute such men and bring the church back to the truth. But Timothy must rise to the duty and be faithful. (See also 1 Timothy 6:3, 6.) And he must refute these men with gentleness, "And the Lord's servant must not be quarrelsome but kind to everyone, able to teach, patiently enduring evil, correcting his opponents with gentleness" (2 Timothy 2:24, 25a ESV).

Also Timothy had health issues so Paul advised him to "No longer drink only water, but use a little wine for the sake of your stomach and your frequent ailments" (1 Timothy 5:23).

Nothing has changed since Paul's day. Missionaries have to stand against false teachers and teaching. Many have health issues—yet persevere with courage.

Do you wonder, as I do, why all these troubles come to God's honored servants? The answer has to be in the word "share" (ESV) or "endure" (NKJV). Suffering is the way our Lord Jesus accomplished the greatest good for the world. We worship a suffering Savior. We glory in the cross. His servants who faithfully proclaim the gospel while suffering follow in the footsteps of our Lord, while facing trials within and without.

I encourage you to check the RBNet website page on missions and see all the RBNet endorsed missionaries, national pastors, chaplains, and support missionaries. As I surveyed the names I know that there are at least a dozen facing trials of some sort. I encourage you to use the RBNet Prayer Guide and pray for them.

Cornerstone Bible Church, Ridgecrest, CA

Cornerstone Bible Church is located in Ridgecrest, CA, a high desert community of about 30,000 people, located 150 miles north of Los Angeles along the southern Sierra Nevada Mountains. The largest employer in the area is the Naval Air Warfare Center, China Lake, where a good number of our church members work. One of the challenges of living and ministering in Ridgecrest is its geographical isolation: it's about 1.5 hours from the nearest population center in the Lancaster-Palmdale area.

In May of this year, our church will be celebrating its 20th anniversary as a constituted church. The church was planted in 2003-2004 through the cooperative efforts of my home church, The Reformed Baptist Church of Riverside, CA; Free Grace Baptist Church of Lancaster, CA; Immanuel Baptist Church of Sacramento, CA; Grace Community Church of Minden, NV; and other participating churches. I have been the primary preaching pastor here since June, 2004. I served the first 11 years in Ridgecrest in the full-time ministry, but the last nine years I've worked full-time as an engineer at the China Lake Navy base to help the church be able to afford its own building. The Lord provided us with a wonderful facility in 2016 which the congregation has significantly improved and paid off earlier this year. Our Lord provides!

I'm thankful for my fellow elder, Kevin Gillette, and our four faithful deacons. We are prayerfully considering Paul Kuttig to be recognized as our third elder and asking the Lord for two additional deacons. Please also pray for me as I continue medical care for prostate cancer.

2022-2023 was a challenging time for us in that several key families joined the exodus of people leaving California. The Lord has demonstrated His faithfulness to us in bringing more people into our fellowship so that our membership and attendance are higher than ever! What a lesson for me that the Lord arranges the members in the body, just as He pleases!

We have had other encouraging outreach opportunities including the Desert Empire Fair in October and the Petroglyph Festival in November.
