CALVIN TO THE SPANISH WORLD

Over the past year, I've spent considerable time reading John Calvin's *Institutes of Christian Religion*, and have found J. I. Packer's evaluation to be a bull's eye: "Calvin's Institutes is a river of pure, gospel truth. No book outside Scripture has so greatly shaped evangelical Christianity. It breathes doxology, devotion, and disciplined thinking."

Simultaneously, the Lord put into the hands of RBNet a large donation of \$250,000 for kingdom extension purposes. One of the endeavors that shouted out for attention was from Poiema Publishing, headed up by RBNet's new missionary David Adams, who wrote a few months ago:

"In the 1950's, various members of the Christian Reformed Church denomination began working on Spanish-language translation projects of some of the most historically important Reformed resources. Those different initiatives were eventually unified under the banner 'Libros Desafío,' which was owned by the Christian Reformed Church. In recent years, the denomination found it increasingly difficult to continue publishing and decided to close operations and auction off the translations. With the help of a generous donor, we were able to obtain the rights to some great resources, including the best Spanish translation of Calvin's *Institutes*. This resource has been out of print for several years and we are prayerfully hoping to reprint it within a few months!"

David was present in Coconut Creek for our September GA, and upon the assembly's vote to distribute \$20,000 to Poiema for the printing of 2000 copies of the Institutes, he immediately notified the printer to fire up the presses. The vision was to make many copies available to seminaries, seminary students, and pastors.

When David held up to his camera, at this week's Missionary-All-Call, the big, fat copy of the two volumes bound into a single book, it made our hearts to sing to think of this whole-counsel-of-God gospel medicine poised to flow into the needy Spanish-speaking world. May the Lord use it for great good in the sphere and ministry God has set before us all."

Mission Thoughts

WHY?

Ann Judson had kept her husband Adoniram alive while he was in prison, treated harshly, forced to march, and fed very little. She had risked all to feed him, and to tend him. When Adoniram received "The Black-Sealed Letter" informing him of Ann's death, "At once the desolation overwhelmed him . . . He began to weep, softly at first, later with hoarse, racking sobs." (*To the Golden Shore*, p. 371). WHY? That must have been a question on the mind of Adoniram.

The Psalms are full of the questions "why?" and "how long?". For example, Psa. 10:1 "Why do You stand afar off, O Lord? Why do You hide in times of trouble?" Psa. 89:46 "How long, Lord? Will You hide Yourself forever? Will Your wrath burn like fire?"

Why do You stand afar off, O LORD? Why do You hide in times of trouble? I am quick point out that each of the lament Psalms ends with praise, which indicates a confident faith, and in these Psalms there is often the prayer of faith as illustrated in Psa. 13:3 "Consider and hear me, O LORD my God; Enlighten my eyes, Lest I sleep the sleep of death."

Missionaries know what it means to suffer and experience forms of persecution for the sake of Christ. This has been true throughout missionary history and illustrated most vividly by the life of the great missionary the Apostle Paul. The gospel marches on through the suffering of those who proclaim it. Yet in all the suffering the Lord Jesus prevails and continues to build his church. The Lord granted grace to Adoniram Judson, and he continued his fruitful ministry in Burma and the Lord gave him another faithful wife, Sarah Boardman.

As I write this one of our gospel laborers working in a "closed country" has been ordered to leave. This is a great trial indeed. (And perhaps by the time you read this he and his family will be able to stay...). We pray.

It is right for missionaries, and indeed all of us, to pray "Why?" and "How Long?" while we wait in faith, knowing that the Lord Jesus will build his church.
